This paper is put out by VOLUNTEERS!, an organization of people who believe we must profoundly alter the ways in which we relate to each other and to nature if we are to remain on the planet.

Our future issues will reflect our main concerns: ecology, co-operative life-styles, freedom and personal growth.

As well as putting out the paper, VOLUN-TEERS! will be working within the community to create alternative institutions and lifestyles. We will also take part in major ecological-political issues (such as the 3rd Crossing, the coast oil tanker scheme, and the San Diego convention).

VOLUNTEERS! is a new kind of political organization - libertarian!

What do we mean by libertarian? Decentralization of power, of industry, of living spaces. Tribal, co-operative society - a federation of voluntary communes replacing the state.

From cities, to villages; from mass societies to small groups. We think it's the only way back to the earth and sanity - to a world where all people can have healthy, creative lives.

In a libertarian society, freedom is a major goal. We don't need laws for the sake of laws, we need human-scale societies where people naturally adjust their needs and desires to fit with those of their friends.

This generation is the turning point. We either accept the ending of our time on earth, or seize the dawn of a new age. VOLUNTEER! Ever since the initial burst of enthusiasm with which our culture greeted the opening of the 1970s began to settle down to a much clearer headed and mellower vision of the future, cynicsm and defeatism have abounded. There is no grounds for these feelings of negativity. Freak culture by its sheer growth and vitality has begun to weaken the hold of illegitimate authority (the state) over all of us both straight and freak.

The best example of what is meant by this weakening is in the development of law over the past few years. The field of crimes known as "crimes without victims" (at least 25% of all offenses) is slowly being reduced.

Abortion, homosexuality, divorce, prostitution, and sexual positions other than the legally prescribed "missionary posture" are no longer "crimes".

Censorship of books, periodicals and film has become minimal. The vagrancy law has also been dropped, it is now legal to be poor.

The penalty for marijuana has gone from 3 years in prison (1965) to a \$150 fine (1972) and it will probably be made legal within a year.

As a further example the American Bar Association (the US legal establishment) has recently demanded that all victimless crimes be stricken from the statue books.

What all this means is that the state will no longer meddle or have control over your per-

sonal lifestyle! This is a victory of the greatest magnitude, in fact, it is one of the most progressive steps in human history. From the beginning of time the state has always dictated how its subjects were to have sex, what to eat and smoke or drink, what to read etc. These victories are occuring because of you, Joe or Jane Freak, not because of any political parties, leaders or any of that crap and not out of the altruism or good will of the statesmen but because of your personal lifestyle. Your lifestyle contravenes many of the written and unwritten laws that the state holds over us. Why even this BE-In that we are at is illegal! As such we are all "criminals", as such you



belong to the largest civil disobediance campaign in history! That is what freak culture is, a mass movement of



passive resistance against illigitimate authority. That is why the system is changing, in response to this resistance.

The state cannot repress a mass cultural movement such as ours, it has tried. The courts of Canada and the US are backlogged for the next several years with drug, draft, and vag cases and thousands more people daily violate these laws against lifestyle. Faced with a complete collapse of the legal system by sheer innundation, the state finally has to

plete victory over the states laws against personal conduct in the next couple of years. We can't be complacent though, for a much bigger struggle looms on the horizon. This is the struggle to restore ecological balance, to redevelop our innate harmony with nature. It will be a long struggle but I'm sure if we apply ourselves to it the way we have with the rule of law we will win.




You can recognize the stuff, a white powder, by its comparatively cheap price, about 20 bucks a gram. Don't touch it.

FINE WEATHER



There aren't enough women local radical left in organizations outside of women's liberation. VLF was male-dominated, Yippie was male-dominated, the Partisan Party is male-dominated - even Gay Liberation groups are male-dominated. Where are the women needed to change this? Up until about 1968, radical women patiently accepted the lower status they had in political groups. Dynamic, intelligent women found themselves typing manifestos, making coffee, and generally remaining in the background. As a result of their conditioning, they lacked the selfconfidence and aggressiveness that put the men around them into positions of leadership. Many seldom spoke out at meetings, feeling they had nothing to say. But with the rise of women's liberation. these women realized that they had been 'had'. Many left to work solely on women's issues.



That was four years ago. Now women have made their struggle a driving force of the left. In the interim, thousands of women have developed their personalities and talents far beyond what they were. They have taught each other creative and organizational skills once kept out of their reach. They have grown close to other women, discarding many of the divisions and fears that kept them apart in the past. And they have made the liberation of women into possibly the widest-ranging political issue in North America. Meanwhile, however, most other radical left organizations continue under male dominance. This is partly because of the unwillingness of some men to give up the comforts of the status quo. But other men have come a long way in discarding their sexism, and want the stimulation of working with women in positions equal to theirs. Male dominance of the left will remain only as long as

women allow it. And unfortunately, most women have placed themselves in a position of exile. It is time for women to rejoin non-women's organizations, this time with both the vision and the skills to hold equal positions with the men. Without leadership from women, the left will flounder, for the revolution we seek would discard the trappings of a narrowly male death culture: the machismo that has spawned atomic weapons, racial and sexual oppression and the destruction of the earth must be ended inside ourselves.

exclusive women's liberation activity. Some stayed behind to challenge male authority in those groups. They held women's meetings as well has regular group meetings, they



with women. Much more has to be done in women's groups. But to make a thorough change, radical women will have to be active in both fronts.

Volunteers! has a structure that is ideal for women wanting to work on other issues. Work groups of 5 or 6 people move under their own direction on the activities of their choice. In a small group, it is easier to prevent leadership roles from forming, and the roles of spokeswomen (for working together with other work groups) will rotate. Women could set up work groups with other women, or with men, as they choose. And in a close-knit circle, people can't evade their hangups and prejudices: if they would continue their work, they have to face up to where they're at and grow.

Some women fear that history would repeat itself if they rejoined non-women's organizations. But the situation has changed.

Not all radical women left the male-dominated groups for pressed the group to take up women's causes, and they worked to gain self-confidence and skills in order to take up active, responsible positions beside the men.

In the radical SDS offshoot "Weathermen", for instance, women kept contacts with outside women's groups and demanded that men in the organization change with them. As a result of their initiatives, women rose to leadership positions and Bernadine Dohrn became a Weatherpeople spokeswoman.

The time is ripe for women to rejoin with men in political work. Not all women, for some are best working with women alone right now. But there are women who could come back and reshape the structure of the male-dominated groups.
